09-Nov-24	Norman Wheatley	"Songs At The Oscars". Some of the winners you'll know, some you may think "How did that win?" and some that didn't win, which really should have! You will also hear some interesting stories about the artists and composers behind the songs.

Norman Wheatley presented a series of songs, including some background behind their writing, by female songwriters of the 20th Century. Until halfway through last century, women were far more scarce in the male dominated business of music. The presentation included artists such as Dorothy Fields, Peggy Lee, Carole King, Judy Collins, Joni Mitchell and Carly Simon and several others.
13-Oct-25	Steve Prosser	"The Ayes (I's) Have It". Compiled from the submitted lists of member's Top Twenty Songs, Steve Prosser presented a series of songs with titles starting I (e.g. I Will, I Wish, etc). The attendees were invited to guess the song titles from a series of emojis and images.
10-Nov-25	Steve Prosser	"Ladies Only". With the theme and songs suggested by John Garbett, Steve Prosser presented a diverse mix of songs sung by female artists. They will all be well-known artists including, Cilla Black, Dolly Parton, Tina Turner, Diana Ross, Shirley Bassey, Roberta Flack, just to name a few. The attendees were invited to guess the birthplace of each artist.
